

Practice Nursing Pathway for Primary Care

Student Nurse – Studying BSc Adult Nursing Degree to gain a registration with NMC. Career events /practice placements/ rotational placements /spoke days completed in Primary Care Networks to gain insight and experience in all areas of adult Nursing including Primary Care.

You will consolidate the Nursing and Midwifery Council's Standards for competence, and continue developing your own confidence to work without direct supervision. There are also opportunities to commence the preceptorship programme and fellowship to continue professional development. Upon completion of the preceptorship programme, there are opportunities to become a preceptorship champion (encouraging a leadership role).

Formerly qualified Nurses who have taken time out of practice, are able to return to Practice through either an NMC return to Practice programme or a test of competence. In addition, a minimum number of practice hours must also be completed. There are also opportunities to commence the preceptorship programme and fellowship to continue professional development. Upon completion of the preceptorship programme, there are opportunities to become a preceptorship champion (encouraging a leadership role).

You will demonstrate a range of clinical knowledge and skills, along with making informed decisions for the management of patient care. There are opportunities to undertake a Practice Assessor / Practice Supervisor qualification to support student Nurses. In addition, there can be Primary Care Network portfolio opportunities including: Health Inequalities Nurse; Frailty Nurse, Research Nurse & Professional Nurse Advocate.
