

NURSES - ARRS SUMMARY



5 LEVELS OF NURSES can now be employed under ARRS.

There is no cap on the number of General Practice Nurses that can be engaged under the scheme, although there are some varying levels of eligibility criteria depending on the level of Nurse being employed. A breakdown of these five levels can be found below:

Nursing Associate – Currently employed under ARRS

New to general practice nurse (either newly qualified or new to primary care) – Cannot have been previously substantively employed prior to 1st April 2025

Experienced general practice nurse – Must have at least one academic level 6 diploma in a long-term condition. Cannot have been previously substantively employed prior to **1st April 2025**

Enhanced Nurse – Currently employed under ARRS

Consultant Nurse – Holds a master's degree and working toward a PhD/or equivalent research qualification. **Cannot** have been previously substantively employed prior to **1st April 2025**

The Programme is open to all new to primary care Nurses, newly qualified Nurses and Nursing Associates. The programme is mainly virtual taking place online and includes the introduction to Immunisations and vaccinations study days.

Are you a newly qualified GP? We are delighted to announce that Gloucestershire Primary Care Training Hub will be able to provide a further Cohort, for our locally funded GP Fellowship Programme also known as Spark! The next Cohort is scheduled to start in September 2025 and open to GP's working in NHS GP Practices in Gloucestershire, within 12 months of qualifying. The deadline for applications is Monday 1st September 2025. Applications after this date, may still be considered, if individuals meet eligibility criteria.

The Spark GP Programme's offer includes funded educational time, including education sessions, peer support and networking, mentoring from experienced trained GPs, and individual project work to develop your interests. The scheme is designed to support you in the transition to life after CCT and enable you to thrive as a new GP.

LIFESTYLE MEDICINE WEBINAR



The Gloucestershire Primary Care Training Hub welcomes any member of staff from across health and care in Gloucestershire to attend this introductory webinar to lifestyle medicine on **4th September 1-2pm**, with the potential for an ongoing community of practice.

Lifestyle medicine compliments traditional medicine by empowering staff to holistically support behaviour change, enhancing the prevention and management of all long term conditions. This is achieved through contemporary evidence-based understanding of the 6 pillars of lifestyle (nutrition, exercise, stress management, sleep, social connection, avoidance of risky substances) and coaching techniques to support patients to commit to behavioural changes.

We are pleased to have a national speaker, Dr Ayan Panja, practising NHS GP and co-founder of Practice Unbound, to give us an overview of Lifestyle Medicine. We will be joined by Dr Helen Makins to talk about her experiences within secondary care and pain management, along with case study examples from colleagues in local practices and PCNs. This will be an interactive and inspiring session with opportunities for questions. In the session we will also be offering a number of funded lifestyle medicine training places (general practice staff will be prioritised for these funded spaces).

IMMUNISATION & VACCINATION TRAINING



It has been noted that there is currently a demand for Immunisation and Vaccination training. Annual updates can be conveniently completed online using the E-LfH platform provided by NHSE, and the best part is that it's completely free!

For those who are new to General Practice and haven't undertaken any training yet please consider the General Practice Preceptorship Programme! This program starts on Wednesday 3rd September 2025 and is available for all Registered Nursing Associates and Registered Nurses new to Primary Care. It offers a comprehensive 2-day Immunisation and Vaccination course along with various other training opportunities. Moreover, there are 2-hour online sessions scheduled on certain Wednesday lunchtimes between 12:30 PM and 2:30 PM from September 2025 to March 2026.
